1,000 office workers across the UK were surveyed in August 2021.

22% reported that their offices had been redesigned to support hybrid working. [Graphic of office plans on paper and pencil.]

31% were aware of a formal flexi-hours policy in their organisation. [Graphic of a document with a pen.]
